Patrick was also the winner of the McNichols Moot Court Competition, a member of the national moot court team, and was chosen by his peers as a member of the D. Craig Lewis trial team. For his final semester of law school, Patrick was a full-time extern at the Idaho Court of Appeals for the Honorable David W. Gratton. Following law school Patrick clerked for the Honorable Thomas L. Stockard in the Tenth Judicial District Court, and during that time was admitted to the Nevada bar as well. Patrick has experience in ERISA, insurance defense, and real estate litigation, including collection of unpaid benefits, legal-malpractice defense, personal injury defense, lender and servicer liability defense, wrongful foreclosure defense, fair debt collection practices defense, and title disputes. Patrick regularly practices in state and federal courts, and is admitted to practice in each in both Nevada and Idaho.
